Gain essential skills for handling emergency trauma patients, including learning to rapidly assess, resuscitate, stabilize and transport them in pre-hospital scenarios. This internationally-accepted course follows a global standard of accepted practice. You'll gain hands-on experience with practical concepts in applying assessment procedures, managing system-based injuries and integrating corresponding treatments to effectively manage trauma patients.

The skills you learn in this course can be readily adapted to reflect local or regional Emergency Medical Services standards.

The ITLS – Basic course is delivered by experienced practitioners who are skilled in managing traumatic emergencies in a pre-hospital care environment.

The course will be presented to reflect real world incidents using case studies, lectures, skill stations, simulations and other interactive deliver methodologies. Learning strategies also involve applying practical psychomotor skills when treating trauma-related patients.

Note: You will be required to spend an additional two hours of classroom time on skills evaluation and a written examination. Therefore, the total length of the course is 16 hours.
