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Course Description: This course is designed to provide the knowledge, skills, and abilities for First Responder Evaluators to function effectively as an evaluator when examining within the First Responder program. Successful candidates will be able to evaluate all aspects of the First Responder program for students taking initial certification training and for students vying for First Responder re-licensure. The focus of the course is on competency-based evaluation. Candidates will have numerous opportunities in the workshop to evaluate student performance. Candidates will also review and practice the marking and grading criteria to ensure fair and objective evaluations for their students.

Course Goal(s): First Responder Evaluator candidates will obtain the knowledge, skills, and abilities to effectively conduct consistent and objective competency-based evaluations associated with First Responder initial certification and re-licensure.
