The review will include practicing an organized and prioritized patient assessment, intervening in a variety of life-threatening injuries and conditions, treating a variety of medical and traumatic emergencies, practicing the use and application of all First Responder equipment, and reviewing the recording and reporting of patient information.

**Course Goal(s):** To provide an opportunity for First Responder Providers to review, practice, and receive coaching and feedback on all their First Responder knowledge and skills in preparation for re-licensing evaluation.
