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Course Description: This course will cover the materials required for certification of First Responder Provider Level III and CPR for Health Care Providers (level C) and Automated External Defibrillator. This course will teach learners skills to assist patients from the moment of arrival until the ambulance arrives. This course will teach the Priority Action Approach, critical interventions, respiratory and circulatory management, Oxygen therapy and minor wound management. This course will expose learners to the types of scenarios they must deal with in the fields of justice and public safety. It will assist learners in assessing their aptitude for administering first aid as well as provide certification useful for many types of employment.

Course Goal(s):

The goal of this course is to certify learners with a first aid course that is recognized as an entry requirement by many justice and public safety fields. The course will equip students with the skills to initiate early assessment and treatment of basic life-threatening traumatic injuries as part of an integrated continuum of patient care with other pre-hospital agencies.

Course Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, the participant will be able to:

- Assess personal aptitude for dealing with first aid and emergency situations
- Use the FR III and CPR "C" and Automated External Defibrillator certifications towards justice or public safety admissions applications
- Demonstrate the Priority Action Approach
- Apply critical interventions
- Provide Oxygen therapy in a safe manner
- Provide care of wounds, shock and other first aid issues
- Prepare patient information reports

Comments on Delivery Methods:

Within the classroom and during lab time, the course will focus primarily on three areas: developing psychomotor skills; practicing and mastering skills; and following medical patient assessment models. The methodology will include demonstrations, coaching and provision of feedback by the instructor, as well as ample hands-on student practice.

Note: CPR Level C for Health Care Providers will be included as part of this course; therefore, it is not a prerequisite. Furthermore, an additional 6 hours of classroom time is spent on certification exams.

Comments on Evaluation:

Students must achieve at least 60% on the written exams and be deemed “complete” for the practical evaluations.

Other Course Guidelines, Procedures and Comments:

Typically CPR level “C” is a prerequisite for First Responder Provider Level III. Since this course is a requirement into the program of Justice and Public Safety Career Preparatory Program for Aboriginal Learners, the prerequisite has been included as part of the course. The First Responder Provider Level III course is 32 hours and CPR Level C is 8 hours which makes this course a total of 42 hours (3 credits).
