**Prerequisites:** First Responder Level 3 with Spinal Endorsement or BCAS Paramedic Level 1 qualification or greater. Medical certificate showing physical and mental capability to perform as a First Aid Attendant.

**Equivalent Course(s) within the JI:** n/a

**Brief Description:** This 1-day skills-based workshop gives First Responders and Paramedics the skills and knowledge to be able to function as an Occupational First Aid Attendant in an industrial setting.**Evaluation Profile:** Complete/Incomplete on all Practical evaluations

**Passing Grade (if applicable):** 70% on all written evaluations

**Evaluation Methods and Percentage of Total Grade:** One written multiple-choice exam and various skills checklists. Students must obtain a minimum of 70% on the written evaluation and be deemed “complete” on all skill checklists.

**Learning Outcomes / Goals:** To teach the skills and knowledge to the First Responder and Paramedic so that they can function effectively as an Occupational First Aid Attendant in industry.

### Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, the participant will be able to:

- Contrast the roles and responsibilities between a First Responder and an Occupational First Aid Attendant
- Identify the Occupational First Aid Attendant’s scope of practice
- Assess and manage minor wound injuries
- Complete a Patient Assessment that meets Worker’s Compensation Board requirements
- Assess and manage specific injuries not covered in their initial First Responder training but are required to meet Worker’s Compensation Board requirements

- Demonstrate specific rolls and lifts for spinal patients that were not covered in their initial First Responder training but are required to meet Worker's Compensation Board requirements

**Course Topics/Content:**

- Roles, responsibilities, and scope of practice of the Occupational First Aid Attendant
- First Aid room techniques and small wound management
- Documentation specific to the Occupational First Aid Attendant
- Referring patients to medical aid
- Patient assessment
- Specific injuries
- Lifts and rolls
- Skills review and evaluation
