Course Description:

This 2 day workshop is for those in the helping professions such as social workers, mental health staff, counsellors and clinical psychologists. Eye Movement Integration (EMI) is a powerful and yet very simple psychotherapeutic tool to effectively help clients who suffer from recurrent and negative memories from any traumatizing experience, including those with PTSD. As the name implies, EMI uses the natural interrelationship of eye movements and thought processes to aid in the integration of distressing memories with beneficial, counter-balancing memories and information. Natural resolution of memories is sometimes blocked after traumatic experience, and these memories may remain isolated and fragmentary.

At the end of this 2-day workshop, participants will be able to describe the basic principles and stages of the EMI approach and treatment, understand the possible mechanisms underlying its efficacy, explain how to overcome client resistance and how to take appropriate precautions with clients.

Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Describe the different stages of the EMI treatment.
- Identify clients who would benefit from EMI.
- Discuss how to overcome client's resistance.
- Identify the various precautions to take with clients.
- Implement EMI in their professional work with clients, applying all of the knowledge demonstrated in the preceding objectives.

Course Topics/Content:

- The Origins of EMI.
- The role of eye movements in everyday life.
- Description of the numerous applications of EMI.
- How memories are recorded.
- Evaluation and assessment in EMI.
- How to target the right memory.
- Eye movement patterns used in EMI.
- EMI treatment.

- Closing the treatment.
- Closing an “incomplete” treatment session.
- Subsequent treatment sessions and follow-up.
- Dealing with client resistance.
- Additional considerations and information (medication, timing the application for EMI, frequency, number of treatments, etc.).
- EMI with children.
- Prevention of PTSD for the client and for the therapist.
