Course Description: Deputy Sheriffs train in the knowledge and use of the Smith and Wesson, 9mm semi-automatic pistol. Sheriff marksmanship training is a blend of shooting accuracy and speed within an umbrella of safe gun handling. Classroom theory and range practice make up the curriculum. Training starts from the most basic elements and prepares students for more intense levels of training.

Course Goal(s):

- Students will be proficient in safe gun handling and basic marksmanship.

Course Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, the participant will be able to:

- Meet the provincial course of fire required minimum standard
- Demonstrate proper techniques for loading, reloading and clearing malfunctions
- Demonstrate the proper technique for presenting the firearm
- Demonstrate safe pistol handling
- Identify the parts of the pistol
- Describe the legal requirements for the use of lethal force
- List the components of a cartridge
- Identify the correct ammunition for their service pistol
- Identify and demonstrate the four points of marksmanship
- Demonstrate proper pistol cleaning and maintenance
