Course Description - Week Four:

You will also review your role as a resource person and the importance of advocacy. You will have the opportunity to examine case studies and further explore strategies in working with youth.

This module will examine personal conflict styles and practice specific approaches to resolving conflict within the context of your work with children, youth, and families. You will also review how to be a resource person and advocate.
